Dear Mr. President:

We write to you today to respectfully request that every effort be made to address critical human rights and humanitarian imperatives involving Afghans at risk. There is no question that the U.S. military withdrawal and the Taliban assumption of authority has created enormous risks to hundreds of thousands of Afghans.

While the Taliban is offering reassurances to eschew revenge and respect women's rights, there is much skepticism due to the Taliban's long record of egregious, systematic, and widespread violations of human rights. As recently as last week, the United Nations (UN) cited several reports of serious abuses, including summary killings, and a UN spokesperson noted that "women are already being killed and shot for breaching rules."

Under these circumstances, we urge you to help evacuate Afghans targeted by the Taliban. For as long as possible, U.S. troops deploying to Kabul should remain in place beyond the embassy evacuation to scale up flights to finish the airlift of special immigrant visa holders and to facilitate charter evacuation flights for Afghan women and human rights activists, journalists, and religious and ethnic minorities, all of whom will face grave danger without immediate assistance.

Also essential is the establishment of a humanitarian corridor to facilitate the flight for those Afghans at risk who will not be able to depart by air.

Additionally, we ask that the administration engage the Afghan diaspora community on these critical issues. Many Afghan families in diaspora are trying to find ways to help sponsor relatives who are in Afghanistan right now, but the process has been unclear and bureaucratic. This community could serve as a critical partner and asset to the administration.


The United States must act swiftly to save lives. Afghans are dying trying to board flights, and there are reports that women of the country would rather die than face rule under the Taliban.
